

Why Google for Education?

We have made chosen to develop the use of Google in Education as a resource for the school for a number of reasons:

- It is free to everyone;
- It safe and secure;
- Its designed for schools and pupils;
- It supports all aspects of the curriculum;
- Beyond the core apps there are hundreds of apps and resources designed for and approved by educators, which interact with each other easily;
- Manageability and ease of accessibility.



Google's suit of applications (Apps) can be used on any internet enabled device or connected device (this includes internet TVs, smartphones, tablets, PCs, Macs, notebooks, Chromebook, games consoles, eReaders (Kindle) to name a few, as long as it has a screen and a browser you are away.

The average British household now owns 7.4 internet devices, with four out of 10 households buying a tablet in the last year.

Smartphones are the most common internet-enabled device, at 1.7 per household, followed by laptops (1.3) and tablets (1.2).

Seven out of 10 households now own at least one tablet, while 19% have two and 11% own three or more.


