

Pupil Premium Strategy

The Pupil Premium (PP) grant is an element of school funding provided specifically for the purpose of supporting disadvantaged or vulnerable students. The principle aim is to “narrow the gap” in achievement that exists between these groups and other students within the school and nationally.

This additional funding is calculated using the number of children that have received Free School Meals at any point in the last 6 years; that have been in continuous local authority or foster care for more than 6 months; that are children of parents that are currently in the armed forces or have been in the past 3 years. Additionally, children adopted from care or leaving care under a special guardianship order are now included in the PP calculation.

The Pupil Premium may be spent by the school as it deems appropriate for the educational benefit of pupils registered at that school. The grant does not have to be completely spent in one financial year; some or all of it may be carried forward to future financial years.

A. Improving and maintaining pupil premium pupil's attainment and progress in line with their peers.

B. Pupils with weak language and communication skills.

C. Pupils with English as an additional language and new to the United Kingdom.

E. Attendance & Punctuality.

Evidence or rationale for approach	Our school's deprivation indicator is greater than the national average and families are struggling financially. In year admissions and leavers are increasing due to families being evicted and re-located.				
Intended impact	Pupils and parents are supported and the social and emotional barriers are reduced.				
Measurable success criteria	Pupils are in school attaining in line with their peers and improved parental engagement.
